

## **About the The Beautify Lunada Bay Project**

It grew as a partnership between Lunada Bay neighbors who wanted to improve, protect, and beautify our bluff tops.

Initial funding was generated via donations and volunteerism amongst Lunada Bay residents and the Lunada Bay Homeowners Association. The City of Palos Verdes Estates will provide mulch, stones, and boulders from their existing reserves. The Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy is growing native plants for the Pilot Project.

Plans for a one acre Pilot Project adjacent to Lunada Bay Elementary School crosswalks, at the intersection of Paseo Lunado and Via Anacapa, have been approved by the City. The Pilot Project will revitalize this one acre parcel with...

- attractive year round landscaping
- low growing, drought tolerant native plants
- nectar, seeds, and berries for butterflies and migrating birds
- decomposed granite walking trails, with natural PV stone edging
- occasional boulders for seating
- erosion protection
- year round ocean and white water view protection
- a hands-on learning area for children
- volunteer opportunities for community members
- a living example of what bluff transformation might look like
