



Trifold Flyer for Phase 2: Side 1




Overview of Phase 2 of the Beautify Lunada Bay Project

- The stone-lined, decomposed granite walking trail from Phase 1 (BLB1) would continue to the intersection of Via Alvarado.
- · As before, occasional boulders would be added for seating.
- Plants would be selected from a palette of low-growing, droughttolerant native plants that are attractive year round (see reverse).
- The City of Palos Verdes Estates would provide stones to line trails, mulch, and water for three years.
- Volunteers would do most of the work and maintain the site into the future.

 - Positive: Attracts birds and butterflies; no trucks driving over property; people picking up after dogs, reduces dust; people stay on trails; looks nice
